CSSL LAUNCHES CODE OF ETHICS AND CODE OF CONDUCT FOR ICT PROFESSIONALS





The Computer Society of Sri Lanka (CSSL) recently launched its Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct with an intention to formalise the process among its members and professionals in the Information Technology (IT) sector.

The CSSL President Yasas V. Abeywickrama believed that the launch was an important milestone for the entire industry and the launch is indeed a much-needed intervention in time for the future of IT professionals of the country.

"With these codes, now the IT industry in Sri Lanka has a comprehensive professional framework in place. This should ensure high level of professionalism in our industry" said CSSL President Yasas V. Abeywickrama during the launch.

CSSL's Code of Conduct bounds itself to rules that are within the core values of the Society's Code of Ethics. These include professionalism, professional development, added value to Sri Lanka, Honesty and Competence.

The keynote address for the launch was Dr Prathiba Mahanamahewa a senior lecturer on Commercial Law at the Faculty of Law, University of Colombo.

"The launch of the CSSL Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct is a great start for us. While there is no mandatory national policy for the industry just as yet, this framework will set the groundwork towards protecting the industry and the people directly or indirectly involved in the industry, especially the future recruits. The CSSL Codes are very much on par with many other international Codes of Ethics and Conduct and we appreciate the significant effort of CSSL to develop this framework" said Dr Prathiba Mahanamahewa.

Through the launch of CSSL's Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct, the Society not only has contributed to the industry by fulfilling a needed requirement but will also hopefully inspire similar professional societies in both the industry and otherwise to also take into consideration the importance of the launch and thereby start similar initiatives on their own.

CSSL President further added that his organisation has a rich history of over four decades and this strong comprehensive professional framework is an evolution of the work the organisation has done over a long period of time and establishing this framework is one of the golden historical achievements of CSSL as well as of the entire IT industry in Sri Lanka.

The launch event was attended by CSSL Past Presidents, Members and industry and academia representatives including UCSC Director Professor K P Hewagamage and FITIS Chairman Dr Kithsiri Manchanayake.

From all corporates/organisations -To share the attached Code of Ethics and Code of Conduct with all your staff, and also for all new recruits handover a copy of it as the national professional framework for IT professionals. **From Academia -** To share this with all IT students and also discuss it under relevant subject/s such as 'Professional Issues in IT'.

We thank you for the support you give to uplift the professionalism in our industry.





CSSL Code of Ethics

Every CSSL member is expected to uphold and respect the dignity, honour and value of being a professional. CSSL stresses that every professional should act as a responsible Sri Lankan first and foremost before he/she can become a successful professional. CSSL, at all instances, expects the conformance of all individuals involved to have as per the following CSSL Code of Ethics:

1. Professionalism

That you will work to improve the value and virtue of the society and respect all its members while protecting the safety, welfare and health of the community.

2. Professional Development

You will always work in your professional interests to develop your career while also enhancing the professional development of your colleagues and fellow staff.

3. Added Value to Sri Lanka

You will work diligently to strive to enhance the value of Sri Lanka and its citizens in any possible way and place the interests of your country above those of personal sectional interests.

4. Honesty

Maintain honesty in all dealings and in your representation of knowledge, skill and services. In addition to that, you are required to strive in order to protect the public from misinformation and misinterpretation.

5. Competence

You will pay meticulous and diligent attention to work competently for your stakeholders and perform services only in areas of competence.



CSSL Code of Conduct

As members of CSSL, we identify the value of our technologies and the role it plays in the development of Sri Lanka in addition to how it can affect the quality of life, both in Sri Lanka and across the world. We acknowledge our profession and as members of CSSL, we are obligated to commit ourselves to working with the highest standards of responsibility, integrity and professional and ethical conduct.

We hereby agree to be bound to the rules mentioned herewith which are as per the core values set in the CSSL Code of Ethics:

1. Professionalism

- a) To protect all confidential information belonging to CSSL and any personal information of CSSL employees, members, clients and other stakeholders.
- b) Not conforming with competing individuals to fix rates or reduce price competition through the allocation of markets or customers and not manipulating bids in any process of bidding or partaking in activities that will lead to restricting trade.
- c) To not infringe or misuse any intellectual property.
- d) Unfailing promise to treat all people with fairness
- e) Not engaging in harassment of any nature, be it sexual harassment, bullying or cyberbullying, in person, via technology or otherwise.
- f) Not being discriminatory in any aspect irrespective of age, colour, disability, ancestry, origin, race, religion, gender, appearance, political affiliation, marital status, etc)
- g) Being respectful to everyone, inclusive of CSSL members and behaving in a professional manner.
- h) Respectful to the privacy of all individuals and protecting their personal data and information.

2. Professional Development

Being well informed about new technological trends, standards and practices that are of relevance to your work. You will be expected to offer your skills and advice and therefore, knowledge in this field should be up to standard and you should encourage the same for your colleagues and staff.

Ensure that the knowledge and experience that you have acquired are shared in such as way that the recipient can enhance his/her skills and effectiveness in work and show more keenness to shoulder additional responsibilities. As per the above values, you are expected to:

- a) Work towards upgrading your knowledge and skills
- b) Being aware if any issue has a subsequent effect on the profession and on public relationships



- c) Support training, professional and educational development in the ICT sector of Sri Lanka to accommodate the varied requirements of employees, students and colleagues to pursue their profession
- d) You should pay diligent attention to enhance the image, reputation and status of the ICT field and that of the profession.

3. Added value to Sri Lanka

No matter what professional activity we engage in, one underlying objective all CSSL members uphold is to add value to our country - Sri Lanka.

Building our nation together and taking it to greater heights will always be the sole interest of all CSSL members.

Every CSSL member will look for ways in which they can contribute to the development of the country with their professional expertise.

4. Honesty

At all times, do not breach the trust the public has in the profession and neither the specific trust of your stakeholders. Utmost honesty and integrity should be the underlying factor in all your professional actions and decisions.

Undoubtedly, many circumstances will arise during the course of your professional career where it can be advantageous for you to be deceptive in some way or the other. In any event, this type of behaviour and professional conduct will not be acceptable.

In accordance with this value you will:

- a) Strongly reject bribery of any form.
- b) Avoid real or perceived conflicts of interest whenever possible and disclosing it to the affected parties, should they exist.
- c) Avoid knowingly misleading a client or potential with regards to the sustainability of a product or service.
- d) Be clear with distinguishing between your professional and personal opinions and advice.
- e) Always give realistic estimates for any projects under your control.
- f) Give credit for the work done by others wherever credit is due.
- g) Recognize professional opinions which you know are based on limited knowledge and experience.
- h) Avoid attempting to augment your own reputation at the expense of another's.



5. Maintain competence

Only accept such work which you believe you are competent and able to perform. Do not hesitate to enlist additional expertise from appropriately qualified individuals when deemed advisable. You should always be well aware of your own limitations and never knowingly imply that you have the competence you do not possess. This does not hold true for accepting a task that calls for additional expertise other than your own for its successful completion. You are not expected to be knowledgeable in all facets of ICT but you are expected to be cognizant of when you require additional expertise and information.

In accordance with this value you will:

- a) Make sure at all times to provide products and services which are in accordance to the operational and functional requirements of your stakeholders.
- b) Avoid misinterpreting your skills and knowledge.
- c) Respect and protect your stakeholders' proprietary interests.
- d) Be continuously updated and aware of relevant standards and legislations and act accordingly.
- e) Accept full responsibility for your work.
- f) Advice your stakeholders when you genuinely believe a proposed project, product or service is not in their best interest.
- g) Respect and whenever necessary, seek the professional expertise of colleagues in their areas of competence.
- h) You are required to have a passion and willingness to develop skills, knowledge and competence in the field of ICT.





GOVERN IT TO SUPPORT BUSINESS EXCELLENCE

- Many organizations are investing considerable funds in Information Technology with the expectation of business improvements.
- All enterprise governance expects a clear visible return on IT investment though it may not realize in many instances.
- IT professionals are facing the problem of convincing the outcomes of IT investments to the first level executives /board of governance
- In many cases IT solutions are not selected based on enterprise objectives, affordability and acceptable level of risk

Developed countries in the west have adopted IT Governance frameworks as an answer for this issue.

CSSL FACILITATES PROGRAM TO STOP ABUSE OF Social Media

Due to the recent civil unrest, the Government had to ban social media in Sri Lanka. While appreciating the Government's quick response and various measures taken to avoid spreading violence across the country, the Computer Society of Sri Lanka (CSSL) requested the Government to restore the normalcy for the social media use once the situation became under control.

However, as responsible professionals the CSSL is facilitating a program to identify how such situations can be better managed in the future, and what processes can be implemented to have a more conducive and peaceful digital environment. In this context, CSSL gathered the technical experts to formulate ways of

better managing social media whilst ensuring freedom of speech. All relevant stakeholders were brought onto one platform on 23 March.

As a result of the all stakeholder platform the CSSL created on stopping misusing of social media, a Working Group was born with multistakeholder representation. The Working Group met on 29 March for the first time with CSSL President Yasas V. Abeywickrama as the Chair of the Working Group. The Working Group identified areas of their work, and will be meeting regularly to review the progress, and take the strategies forward. It is expected that this group will develop a multitude of strategies to promote better use of social media.

- Develop the relevant knowledge and content, so that it can be given to authorities where necessary and enable engagement with relevant stakeholders


The working group will not take political views about the matters within or outside the above scope in relation to the work it carries out.

Prof. Gihan V. Dias

Prof. Dias graduated from the University of Moratuwa in 1985 and was awarded a doctorate in Electrical Engineering and Computer Science from The University of California, Davis in 1992. In addition to being a Professor in Computer Science and Engineering and Director, International Relations at the University of Moratuwa, Sri Lanka he serves as the Domain Registrar of the LK Domain Registry and as an advisor to TechCERT, Sri Lanka's premier information security body. He has been active in several areas of computing, including computer networking, language technologies, e-learning, security, Internet identity and personal cloud. He has assisted many public and private organisations to build, secure, and make best use of their computer systems. He served as a Trustee of the Internet Society from 2014 to 2017. He was inducted to the Internet Hall of Fame in 2013 and received the SEARCC ICT Professional of the year award in 2017.



CSSL CALLS FOR REVIEW OF FTA SIGNED WITH SINGAPORE

The Computer Society of Sri Lanka (CSSL) as the representative body of the IT professionals in Sri Lanka have been taking part in the dialogues with regard to the signing of several Free Trade Agreements (FTA) between Sri Lanka and countries including Singapore, India and China towards developing our nation. CSSL Executive Council and membership have always been optimistic about the outcomes of the FTAs and have updated at the meetings about the safeguard of our own Sri Lankan IT professionals, especially with regard to the Mode 4 of the proposed FTAs, around presence of natural persons.

However, after reviewing the signed FTA between Sri Lanka and Singapore which has been signed in January, the CSSL council is having some concerns over the liberalization of

IT profession compared to Legal, Engineering and Architecture professions, ((752) & (CPC 84)) where it states horizontal commitments and horizontal conditions.

Therefore, we earnestly request the government to discuss this matter with CSSL and other IT industry stakeholders before the agreement is put into action. While we appreciate FTAs to broaden our trade and make Sri Lanka a hub in the region, we need to carefully evaluate the impact on the IT community in Sri Lanka and the economy before these things are rushed into action. 
